



## ANNUAL REPORT 2003

The non-profit association EUCC-Germany (EUCC - Die Küsten Union Deutschland) was founded on 18. Nov. 2002 in Warnemünde, in Germany. Aims are to support education, information, public relation, projects and national as well as international cooperation in the field of sustainable coastal development and ICZM. The activities are restricted to the German territory. The council consists of 6 members, a chairman, two vice chairmen and 3 additional persons. The extended council ensures that all German coastal federal states and regions are represented. EUCC-Germany is represented in the council of EUCC International by Dr. G. Schernewski.

- **Newsletter:** 740 subscribers (network members), 10 issues total, 2500 downloads per issue (<http://www.eucc-d.de/newsletter.php>).



- **IKZM-D Lernen:** Development of a database tool for preparation of online study modules, the module „ICZM“ in German language is finished and used in two long-distance study courses. Close co-operation with the international module Coastlearn ([www.ikzm-d.de](http://www.ikzm-d.de)).
- **Annual Meeting:** 51 participants, incl. reports, field trip, meetings of members and council.
